## Keep Oconee County Beautiful Events in October

The Keep Oconee County Beautiful Commission has several recycling and beautification opportunities available in the coming weeks:

**Community Shred Day Drive-Thru** - the next free shred day will take place Friday, October 15, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Oconee Veterans Park rain or shine; all shredded paper will be recycled.

**Keep Oconee County Boo-tiful** - no tricks, just treats at this community road cleanup day! Meet at 10 a.m. on Saturday, October 30, at Farmington Depot to pick up tools - KOCBC will have giveaways while supplies last at trash and tool turn in.

**Tire and Battery Amnesty** - throughout the entire month of October, Oconee County residents may bring up to four tires per vehicle to any one of the county's five Recycling/Waste Convenience Centers on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Only tires from cars and light trucks will be accepted, and tires must not be on rims. Auto and boat batteries will also be accepted for recycling with no limits on quantity. Both tires and batteries collected as part of this event will be recycled.

## Notes from IT

### October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month

We all are aware that businesses are hacked every day. DO NOT use your county email to sign up for businesses like Amazon, CVS, Groupon, Walmart, etc. If they have been hacked, your personal identifiable information has been exposed.

If you need to use your county email to sign up for county business, NEVER use the same password that you use to login to your work computer. If you do, you have exposed not only yourself but the entire county. The county has protections for our computers and servers with anti-virus/anti-malware software as well as a firewall. Sometimes emails come through that have a link or an attachment that contain a virus. If you click on those links, you might think that nothing happened but behind the scenes you have downloaded Ransomware or have released a program to capture personal identifiable information.

Don't forget STOP, LOOK, and THINK before you click on a link or open an attachment.

Thanks again to everyone who uses the PhishAlert button on suspicious emails. Because you send me those alerts, we quickly jumped on our phishing email at the end of September.
