

Water Resources Recognized for Excellence with Two Georgia Association of Water Professionals Awards

The Oconee County Water Resources Department recently earned the 2022 Georgia Association of Water Professionals (GAWP) **Gold Distribution System Excellence Award** for its water system and the **Gold Wastewater Collection System Excellence Award** for its sewer system. This is the third year in a row that Water Resources has earned the Gold Award for collections, and the second Gold Award in a row for distribution!

The Gold Distribution System Excellence Award recognizes outstanding performance in Management, Operations & Maintenance, Program Management, and Planning. Oconee County Water Resources earned the award following an extensive audit in the areas of maps and records, metering, field sampling, system design and material standards, maintenance procedures, disinfection procedures, cross-connection control, water loss, finished water storage, pumping facilities, regulatory review, records retention, water quality monitoring plans and facilities, administrative procedures/polices, master planning, funding, communications, and staffing. The Gold Wastewater Collection System Excellence Award was bestowed as a result of the department achieving industry standards for capacity, management, operation, and maintenance following a system-wide audit.

Notes from IT

Vishing and You

Vishing, a combination of voice and phishing, is an attempt to use social engineering over the phone to get sensitive information. This style of attack has many similarities to phishing but because it is over voice it is more immediate and personal which may catch people off guard.

A sense of urgency—used in conjunction with fear tactics—may prompt someone to divulge information they normally would not share. An example of this is threatening someone with arrest or deportation.

A sense of authority - a caller with an authoritative tone may claim to be from an organization you depend on, such as the Social Security Administration or Medicare.

If you suspect a call is fraudulent, do not engage with the caller. If you have given out personal information, contact your financial institutions and alert them. You may also consider freezing your credit report to thwart identity theft.


