



Early Voting Starts October 16 at the Administrative Building

Early voting for the City of Watkinsville General Election will be held October 16 through November 3 at the Oconee County Administrative Building. Voting hours are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each weekday. There will also be two opportunities for Saturday voting, October 21 and October 28, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

As the first early voting event in the new building, Elections staff will be using this election to establish procedures and protocols for future elections.

Registered voters who live within the city limits of Watkinsville are eligible to vote in this election. Voters must be registered by October 10.

Coming in November - Tire and Battery Amnesty - throughout the entire month of November, Oconee County residents may bring up to four tires per vehicle to any one of the county's five Recycling/Waste Convenience Centers on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Only tires from cars and light trucks will be accepted, and tires must not be on rims. Auto and boat batteries will also be accepted for recycling with no limits on quantity. Both tires and batteries collected as part of this event will be recycled.

Notes from IT

Strong Passwords: Quick Tips for Employees

Strong passwords are your first line of defense against cyber threats. As an employee, your commitment to creating, managing, and maintaining strong passwords is crucial for your personal security and for the security of your organization's data and systems. By following these best practices for password security, you contribute significantly to digital security for Oconee County Government.

Complexity Matters - include a combination of the following elements:

- Uppercase letters
- Lowercase letters
- Numbers
- Special characters (e.g., !, @, #, \$, %)

Length is Key - longer passwords are more secure; aim for a minimum of 12 characters, and consider using passphrases—a series of random words or a sentence—as they are both strong and easy to remember.

Avoiding Common Mistakes:

- Don't use easily guessable information like birthdays, names, or common phrases
- Avoid using consecutive keyboard patterns (e.g., "123456" or "qwerty")
- Don't use the same password for multiple accounts

Regular Password Updates - change your passwords periodically, ideally every 90 days; frequent changes can thwart attackers who may have acquired your login credentials.

Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) - whenever possible, enable MFA on your accounts, which adds an extra layer of security by requiring a second authentication method, such as a temporary code sent to your phone.

Beware of Phishing - be cautious when asked to enter your password; verify the legitimacy of the request by double-checking the website's URL and ensuring it's an official login page.


Education and Training - cybersecurity threats are always evolving, so keep up to date on cybersecurity news and best practices to stay safe both at work and at home.
