

Spot The Difference: How You Can Identify Fake Websites

Hello, from the friendly neighborhood IT Techs! This month, we want to touch base briefly about fake websites.

Scammers can make fake websites to trick you into sharing sensitive information, such as passwords, payment details, or personal information they can use to steal your identity. Some fake websites can even infect your device with malware! Next time you decide to click on a website, keep the following points in mind!

How Does the URL Look?

Be wary of any misspellings or unusual domain extensions (i.e.:xyz instead of .gov or .com). Scammers often use slight variations to mimic real sites.


How Does the Website Look?

Does it look sloppy? Genuine websites usually have polished designs. Look for consistent branding, high-quality images, and correct spelling and grammar. Be extra cautious of sites that have excessive ads, pop-ups, or poorly written content. These can be red flags for fake websites.

Be cautious. If a website feels off or seems too good to be true, trust your instincts. It's better to ask one of us for help if a website is real or not, than to accidentally download malware and infect your computer.

By staying informed and following these tips, you can better protect yourself and Oconee County from risks associated with fake websites!

Shawn Wheeler to Retire



After thirty-two years of dedicated service, Shawn Wheeler, the first Director of the Oconee County Civic Center, is set to retire. Graduating from the University of Georgia's Grady School of Journalism in 1981, Shawn initially worked in the Office of Student Affairs before taking on the monumental task of being the Director of the new Civic Center in 1993.

When Shawn Wheeler joined the Oconee County Civic Center in 1993, the county at the time had one dance school, church choirs, and a high school drama club. Since Shawn has been at the helm of the Civic Center, drama and dance programs at both high schools have been established, five dance academies have opened, and four community theatre groups have started, and the Oconee County Civic Center has served as a venue for all.

The Oconee County Board of Commissioners presented a proclamation declaring Tuesday, October 29, 2024, "Shawn Wheeler Day" in Oconee County at the Board's Agenda Setting Meeting in October. The Civic Center will continue to thrive as a testament to Shawn's legacy, ensuring that the arts remain an integral part of Oconee County's community.

Throughout his career, Shawn has collaborated with three different Chairmen, twelve Commissioners, five Finance Directors, and six County Administrators, reflecting his remarkable flexibility and commitment to the community.

As he prepares to leave his position halfway through his thirty second year, Shawn looks forward to focusing on personal projects, traveling with his wife, and spending quality time with his son, daughter, and grandchild.
