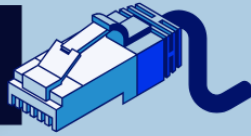
Her reliability, dedication, and professionalism make her a valuable asset to both internal and external customers.

What to Do When During A Cyber Attack!

As the holiday season approaches, it's important to stay alert against cybercrime. This time of year is a favorite for cybercriminals who use tactics to manipulate your emotions and exploit your routines. Here are a couple of examples of how this could happen:

- You receive an email from a former employee, with a link to donate to a children's charity during the holiday season. It seems legitimate, but clicking the link immediately installs malware on your computer!
- A free USB drive is handed to you as a Black Friday gift in a shopping center, and when you plug it into your computer to share files with a coworker, it automatically runs harmful scripts!

Unfortunately, these types of attacks are common and can quickly spread across a network. While it's helpful to know how to avoid these risks, let's assume the worst has happened—you've clicked a malicious link or downloaded a suspicious file. In moments like this, it's natural to panic, but staying calm is key. Here's what you can do to minimize the damage and protect your coworkers:

- 1) **Disconnect From the Network.** In order to prevent any spread of malicious files, it is important that you immediately disconnect your device from the network. If this is a desktop computer, you can do this by unplugging the Ethernet cable from the back of the computer. If this is a laptop or other mobile device, disconnect it from the Wi-Fi.
- 2) **Report the Incident.** Immediately after disconnecting from the network, call a member of the IT Department. You will not get in trouble. We need to know as soon as possible if anything occurs, so we can mitigate any possible spread within the network. If you are unable to reach us via phone, send in an email to ochelpdesk@oconeega.us and move onto Step 3.
- 3) **Turn Off Your Device.** In the event that you cannot immediately reach a member of IT, or we instruct you to, please turn off your device until we can verify that it is free of any malware.

KOCBC will staff collection sites at both Harris Shoals Park and Home Depot on Epps on Saturday, January 9th, from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. If you wish to place your tree in either location prior to January 9, please remove all decorations, lights, and stands and place in designated areas.

Trees are recycled by chipping them into mulch for use in landscaping, or by using them as fish or animal habitats.

The Board of Elections and Registration staff, along with their dedicated poll officials, served a record-breaking number of citizens – 21,272 during the sixteen days of Advance Voting, 4,799 voters on Election Day and 1,804 absentee ballots issued. 86.13% of the electorate in Oconee County cast a ballot in the November 5, 2024 General Election, making Oconee County 1st in the State in voter turnout percentage—Phenomenal! Our poll officials have devoted many hours to serving the citizens of Oconee County, and we are extremely grateful for their commitment to Elections. Elections require team effort and countless hours of preparation to make it happen. Thanks to the collective effort of our poll workers, board members, and staff, all elections in 2024 were a success!
