
Bat Festival Photos

Comms Corner

Welcome to the Communications Corner – let's talk accessibility in Microsoft PowerPoint.

Follow these quick tips to ensure accessible presentations.

1) Use Content Placeholders

Start with an accessible template. Use **View > Slide Master View** to insert, edit and manage content placeholders. All text (except tables and objects with alt text) should display in this pane. This ensures all users have easier access to the text in the slides.

2) Give Each Slide a Unique Title

Slide titles create structure and aid navigation. Keep titles short (use 5-10 words).

3) Add Alt Text to Images and Objects

Use informative and concise alt text descriptions for important graphics or non-text elements.

4) Use Simple Table Structures

Avoid using nested tables, merged or split cells, or blank cells for formatting. Table header rows are essential to provide context to table data.

5) Fill in Document Properties

Open **File > Info > Properties** and enter title, subject, and author in the document's properties.

6) Check the Reading Order

Open **Review > Accessibility Check > Reading Order** tool to verify the order of each slide's content. Note: Reading order may affect object layering.

7) Use the Accessibility Checker Tool

Use the built-in tool in **Review > Check Accessibility** which provides details on potential issues and gives suggestions to correct them.

Yubikeys 101 and Troubleshooting

YubiKeys are small but powerful security devices that help protect our digital identities with two-factor authentication (2FA). Here is a quick guide to using your YubiKey.

How to Use Your YubiKey

1. You will be prompted to use Duo two-factor sign on. Click the **passcode option**.
2. Insert your YubiKey into your device's USB port. Make sure it lights up **green**!
3. Touch the gold disk or button to authenticate.
4. Login to your desktop once it fills in the passcode.

Troubleshooting Help

YubiKey not recognized?

- Try a different USB port or flip the Yubikey orientation.

No response when tapping?

- Ensure your finger is touching the metal contact. Do not hold too long or double-tap.

Authentication fails?

- Confirm caps lock is turned off as the passcode is case sensitive.

Lost your YubiKey?

- Contact IT at ochelpdesk@oconee.ga.us immediately to revoke access and issue a replacement.
